Subject: East Bay Conservation Corps Charter
Charter Renewal Request

ACTION REQUESTED:

Approve the petition from East Bay Conservation Corps Charter (EBCC) to renew its charter to operate in Oakland **as revised**. The Lead Petitioner has agreed to the proposed revisions.

Approve the charter to continue offering EBCC's elementary school program (currently serving grades K-5, and expanding to serve grades K-8) and to continue its Corpsmember high school program for students ages 16-24. If EBCC wishes to implement a comprehensive high school program as a third component, it will either file a major charter amendment or a new charter petition defining that operation.

The term of this charter will be from December 14, 2005 through December 13, 2010, the renewal period required under the Charter Schools Act. The District would not accept a charter renewal request more than 270 days prior to the expiration of this charter; however requests for charter amendments or new charters may be filed at any regular OUSD State Administrator/ Board of Education meeting.

EBCC will notify the district of a student's residence each month when any student drops out or is expelled from the school.

EBCC will provide the District Charter Schools Office a copy of its Uniform Complaint Process (in accordance with provisions of Title 34, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 76.780-783, as defined in Title 5-Education, California Code of Regulations, §4600-4671).¹
