¹ For students with IEPs or 504 plans, a manifestation determination hearing prior to an expulsion hearing and within 10 days from the beginning of the suspension. At the manifestation hearing, members of the IEP team determine if the expellable offense was a manifestation of the student's disability and/or if the team was failing to implement the IEP/504 plan. In most cases, if either answer is yes, the student cannot be expelled. Parents/guardians must be present at the manifestation hearing.

² Hearing can be scheduled beyond the 30 day timeframe if mutually agreed upon by all parties.

³ A Voluntary Stipulated Expulsion is an acceptable alternative to an expulsion hearing if all parties agree.

⁴ Expulsions can be appealed at the county within 30 days of a Notice of Expulsion.
